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OWNERSHIP MINDSET.

- In reality Jesus is the owner (Ps 24:1, Eph 1:22) of the church while we are all stewards (1 Pet 4:10).
- Ministers must have a son/daughter of the owner mentality. My father's house, so I must take responsibility for ensuring all works well. (it is not my department , that is for the PICP or Parish Pastor).
- Hard working not passive (Rom 16:6, Rev 2:2-3).
- Proactive in discharge of duties. (1 Sam 21:8). Haste required.
- Improvement/Growth mindset...Read, Study, Seek counsel and guidance. 10 years bible college certificate is stale.

OWNERSHIP MINDSET.

- Regularly proffering ideas and initiatives to the department/pastorate and not bothering about who takes credit.
- No "Eye Service" but service unto Christ. Eph 6:5-6.
- Be prepared to preach, teach and pray without notice.
- Have a service orientation.(Rom 16:1).
- Evangelise, win souls, invite people to church programmes without prompting.

PULPIT ETHICS:

- A very sacred and exalted place in the church.
- Maintain a good posture, no leaning, no banging. Revere and respect God.
- Not a place for flattery and praise of men. God is our focus.
- Our attitude, mood, and demeanor in the pulpit will have its influence on the degree of reverence and inspiration that will prevail in the service.
- We must be sensitive and not interrupt the flow of worship or move of the Holy Spirit when we take over the microphone on the altar.
- We must not abuse the time allocated for our ministration without express permission of the Senior Pastor (PICP).
- Pulpit is not open to just anybody, only persons approved by the Senior Pastor (PICP) must mount the pulpit.

ETHICS FOR HANDLING VISITING MINISTERS.

- And as ye would that men should do to you, do ye also to them likewise. Luke 6:31
- Invite ministers personally and follow it up with a letter.
- The visiting minister should be welcomed at his point of entry.
- The visiting minister should sit next to the inviting minister.
- Refer to the invited minister by the official designation he has accorded himself.
- Know the full name of your invited guest.
- Identify and introduce the visiting minister's delegation.

ETHICS FOR HANDLING VISITING MINISTERS.

- The visiting minister's wife should be welcomed nicely.
- Use the proper name of the invited minister's church.
- Give the external minister adequate time to minister.
- Introduce your guest minister with excitement.
- Outline and explain specifically to the external minister any function or expectation you may have of him.
- All conditions of the external minister's visit should be clearly defined prior to his arrival/acceptance to minister.
- The honorarium and all expenses can and must be discussed in many cases before the minister accepts the invitation.
- The visiting minister should be refreshed briefly and then politely escorted away.

ETHICS FOR THE TRAVELLING MINISTER.

- Whensoever I take my journey into Spain, I will come to you: for I trust to see you in my journey, and to be brought on my way thitherward by you, if first I be somewhat filled with your company. Romans 15:24
- Show respect to ministers and churches to which you have been invited.
- Do not invite yourself to minister in other people's churches.
- Never allow the lure of generous honorariums to become your primary reason for ministering.
- Do not misuse the exposure given you by this invitation. Whoso rewardeth evil for good, evil shall not depart from his house. **Proverbs 17:13**

ETHICS FOR THE TRAVELLING MINISTER.

- Do not promote yourself. Show appreciation to the host pastor and to the church in which you are ministering.
- Flow with the theme of the programme to which you have been invited.
- Promote and lift up the ministry of your host. Do not just use the pulpit to promote your own ministry.
- Invite people who invite you (RECIPROSITY).

FINANCIAL ETHICS.

- For the love of money is the root of all evil: which while some coveted after, they have erred from the faith, and pierced themselves through with many sorrows. 1 Timothy 6:10.
- Pay your tithes and give offerings generously as a good minister.
- Do not receive money on behalf of the church.
- Do not personally count the offerings.
- Do not allow money to be counted in the full view of everyone in church.
- Do not take Sunday's, or any other offering to your house.

FINANCIAL ETHICS.

- If you receive an unusually large gift, personally or in the offering (for instance, an expensive car) you must question the source of it.
- Generally speaking, do not borrow money. Try to manage with what you have. Do not borrow money from the church nor from the offerings. You may be accused of stealing from the church.
- Do not borrow money from church members. *they may lose their respect for you.*
- Do not ask church members for material things or for money.
- Do not receive money on behalf of church members.

FINANCIAL ETHICS.

- Do not act as a surety or guarantor for your church members. Prov 22:26.
- Do not lend money to church members.
- Do not allow money and gifts to be the basis of relationships you have with people.
- Do not demand or charge a fee as a condition for praying for someone or for prophesying to him. ... freely ye have received, freely give. Matthew 10:8.
- Do not ask people directly how much they earn or how much they have.
- Do not announce your salary and assets publicly. 2 Kings 20:13, 14, 17.
- Your financial needs should not affect your preaching and speech.
- If you make a large financial pledge do not announce it publicly.
